Purpose	Create a more robust dialogue and understanding, and develop improved strategic partnerships with organizations that have criticized our response to bad actors in higher education. Enlist these organizations' help to develop actionable solutions to protect the integrity of the GI Bill.		

### Background:

With the complexities of the Post-9/11 GI Bill and the changing higher educational environment, VA has expanded its role from an administrator of benefits to creator of the well-informed consumer, and is now pivoting to enhancing its role in enforcement through more aggressively exercising its authorities to protect Veterans from dishonest schools.

VA called this symposium to discuss possible answers to these questions:

- How far should VA go in creating informed consumers? Can we be more proactive in quality and quantity of our communications?
- How far should VA go in asserting its enforcement authorities independent of State authorities?
- How do we best balance protecting our beneficiaries through enforcement actions with potentially derailing their educational pursuits/progress? (i.e. withdrawing GI Bill approval from DeVry and impacting 15,000 GI Bill beneficiaries at over 70 campuses in over 20 states)?
- What should be the standards of evidentiary basis on which VA would take various forms of enforcement action (POE removal, suspension, withdrawal), either unilaterally or through a request to a State Approving Agency? (i.e. Dept. of ED findings/action; Complaint voted out by the Federal Trade Commission)?

#### **Summary:**

- This symposium served to further open the communication lines between government and service organizations, and to enhance the dialogue as to how to best protect the interests of our Veteran students.
- Discussion centered on VA enforcement mechanics and potential triggers; VA compliance with title 38 UCS; and how to assist student veterans at ACICS-accredited schools. While some participants felt shutting down schools for deceptive marketing and misleading students would prevent such in the future, others felt great care must be taken in considering the impacts of such actions

on current enrollees who would suddenly have to change the course of their academic pursuits.

 Going forward, we will examine the enforcement tools we currently have and keep the communication lines open among all parties to enable student Veterans to make the best choices possible for their educational pursuits.

#### **Action Items:**

- VA General Counsel, Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and other federal agencies examine the range of interim steps VA may be able to take during the process of an FTC (or other federal agency) investigation. (assigned to FTC, VA OGC, VA OEO)
- 2. Full Sail/RICO: DOJ and VVA will coordinate enforcement efforts. (assigned to DOJ, VVA)
- 3. Review VA/FTC Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to better clarify information sharing process and standards of evidence. (assigned to FTC)
- 4. VA to establish a schedule to write new regulations covering GI Bill oversight, or find other non-regulatory methods to codify VA's enforcement triggers and approach. (assigned to VA OEO)
- 5. Expand the continuum chart to look at all sources of complaints and possible actions. (assigned to FTC, ED, VA OEO)
- 6. Work with partners at Department of Education on ACICS accrediting revocation fallout and teach out plan; keep Department of Defense updated. (assigned to ED, VA OEO)
- Consider increased authority for SAAs to do risk-based reviews and increasing financial resources (\$19 million budgetary request) (assigned to NASAA, VA OEO)
- 8. Develop opportunities to counsel students (current and potential) with assistance from VSOs/NGOs; establish Points of Contact at these organizations (assigned to Student Veterans of America)
